- Addressing the gender pay and pension gap (e.g. *Directive on pay transparency*) as well as the gender care gap

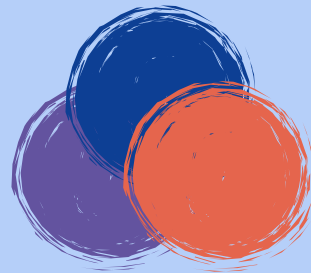
Leading equally throughout society.
